



M.A. in Global Communication and MSc in Global Media and Communications Admission Application Guidelines and Instructions for Fall 2010

Program Description

Admission to this two year dual degree program is limited to the fall term. The first year is completed at the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) and the second year is completed at USC Annenberg School. Faculty members from both schools review applications for admission and decision notification comes from LSE. For students starting the program in 2010, the first year starts in October 2010 and the second year begins in August 2011.

Application Process and Filing Guidelines

Applicants must submit admission application materials to LSE and USC Annenberg. Applications open mid-October. Please apply early as competition for admission is intense. Be sure to monitor program availability on the LSE Web site at www.lse.ac.uk/collections/graduateAdmissions/. Admission decisions are made on a rolling basis.

1) Complete the online LSE application at www.lse.ac.uk/collections/graduateAdmissions/:

- Personal statement
- Two academic letters of reference
- Transcripts from colleges/universities attended
- English language score (if required)
- Application fee (refer to LSE Web site for the fee)

2) Complete the online USC Graduate Admission Application at

www.usc.edu/admissions/graduate/applyonline/.

Upload the materials submitted to LSE. *Note: the USC application fee is waived. However, you must select the waiver when prompted to pay the fee.*

- Personal statement
- Transcripts from colleges/universities attended
- TOEFL or IELTS scores (if required)

English Proficiency

If your first language is not English or the language of instruction of your bachelor degree was not English, you may be required to provide valid TOEFL or IELTS scores. Official scores must be reported electronically to USC (code 4852).

Personal Statement

Please upload a personal statement that describes your academic interests and your purpose and objectives in undertaking graduate study. This is your opportunity to introduce yourself to the faculty selection committee. As LSE and USC do not offer interviews, please use this section to indicate your academic strengths and interests, your motivation for applying to the course and future plans (academic or professional). You may also use this section to give details of relevant internships and vacation/employment which have bearing on your application. Your statement should cover two to three pages; there is no fixed word limit.

Financial Support

Refer to the LSE Web site for first year costs. U.S. citizens and permanent residents may apply for U.S. Federal financial aid since you will be enrolled at USC for both years. For more information and an estimate of second year costs, visit USC Financial Aid Web site at www.usc.edu/admission/fa/. Note: all second year degree candidates are considered for USC Annenberg departmental merit scholarships and research associate positions; no application is required.

Also, LSE Financial Support Office administers a variety of scholarships and awards for incoming students. The terms, conditions, eligibility requirements and value of each individual scholarship or award differ. Note: Please apply for scholarships early; you do not have to wait for an offer of admission before applying.
